




LET'S FOLD SOME LOVE!

ORIGAMI HEART


Fun fact: The geometric shape of the heart was used to depict the foliage of fig leaves, ivy and other plants until the 15th century, after which it began to represent love. The modern heart shape has been used in playing cards since the late 15th century.


Start with the square piece of paper you just cut out. Pattern face down. If you didn't print, and are starting with a blank sheet, mark each side to differentiate. Side facing down, will be the exterior


Fold the paper in half vertically and horizontally to mark the vertical and horizontal center lines, and unfold.


Fold the bottom half up to the score in the middle.

This is how it should look. Flip over.

5



Fold both bottom corners inwards, towards the vertical crease. Both folds should meet in the center.

This is the shape you should end up with. Flip over.

7



Fold the top right and left corner down towards the vertical crease in the middle.

8



This is the shape you should end up with. Fold the top corner to the bottom corner, down the middle, without folding the side triangles. It's tricky - explanation above.


[In the process of folding]

GENTLY SQUEEZE SIDES WHILE FOLDING




Leave the left and right triangles intact by squeezing them on the sides to lift them up as you fold the layer inside them.

This is the shape you should end up with. Fold the left and right triangles inward along the dotted lines.

Fold top right layer corners inward, have them meet in the center to form a triangle.

Repeat step 11 on the left side.

Almost perfect!

Fold the tips of the heart down to meet the yellow triangles, for a less angular heart.




Flip over.
